

Snapdragon
Antirrhinum majus

Squeeze the mouth of the flower open, and watch it snap shut when you let go.

TIP: Look for this red-pink flower on walls and cracks in the pavement.

Meadow Buttercup
Ranunculus acris

Hold the yellow flower under your chin. If there's a yellow shine on your chin it means you like butter.
FACT: The petals act like mirrors



Daisy
Bellis perennis

These pretty white flowers are everywhere in the summer but have you looked at them closely? Each petal and yellow bit in the middle is a separate flower.
TIP: Make a daisy chain to wear around your head.

Herb Robert
Geranium robertianum

These pretty pinky-red flowers are not fussy where they grow. You will see them in cracks in the pavement, hedgerows and road verges. Crush some leaves for a pongy stink!
DID YOU KNOW? This flower is also known as 'Stinky Bob'.



Count the butterflies you see feeding on the lilac-coloured flowers.
TIP: This is a rapidly spreading plant often found alongside railway tracks.



Greater Stitchwort
Stellaria holostea

This white star like flower is also known as Daddy's shirt buttons or poor-man's buttonhole. Hunt for this in woods, roadside verges, hedgerows and grassy banks
ACTION: Pick one for your button hole.

TIP: Pick a small posy and take them home. Put them in water and pop them on the table for everyone to enjoy.




Wild flower fortune teller

Fold, following the instructions ▶

Choose a number:

1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8

-  Cut this part off
-  Fold in half, the corner to corner, unfold and repeat with the other corner, unfold again.
-  Fold each corner so it points to the middle.
-  Turn it over
-  Fold each corner so it points to the middle.
-  Turn it over
-  Fold in half, and unfold again just to make a crease.
-  Work your fingers into the four corners from the fold side - work the creases to form four points.
