

Wild flower ID guide

INTRODUCTION

This illustrated guide to 99 common flowers has been produced to help people identify plants from a wide range of different habitats.

The species are chosen to be easy to identify. The list includes such familiar plants as Traveller's-joy and Hawthorn from Hedgerows, Bluebell from woodland, Heather from moorland and Marsh-marigold from wetlands.

HOW TO USE THIS GUIDE

The flowers have been arranged by colour and strips on the edge of the page should help you to find groups of flowers of the same colour. At the end of the book is a section on ferns, trees and shrubs. Both the English and Latin names for each plant are given along with further information about when the plant flowers, its size, habitat and key features which help you distinguish it from other plants. You may find it helpful to take with you a small ruler, marked with millimetres.

Bluebell

Hyacinthoides non-scripta

Narrow tube-like dark blue scented flowers with up-rolled tips.

HABITAT Woodlands, also hedgerows and grassland.

LEAVES AND STEMS narrow leaves 1-2cm wide.



deep blue flowers oval, blunt leaves

Brooklime

Veronica beccabunga

Sprawling plant with spikes of blue flowers ascending in pairs from the leaf bases.

HABITAT

Wet meadows, marshes, ponds, streams, wet woods.

LEAVES AND STEMS fleshy stems, rounded at base, 3-6cm long, shallow teeth and short stalked.

Bugle

Ajuga reptans

Creeping plant with upright dense leafy flower spikes 10-30cm tall of blue flowers.

HABITAT Damp woods, hedge banks, meadows.

LEAVES AND STEMS Opposite leaves sometimes bronzy, hairless and scarcely toothed. Stem square with hairs.

Distinctive flowers

(look at lower leaves - if the leaves are opposite it is Heath Milkwort)

Alternate leaves

Common Milkwort

Polygala vulgaris

Short (15-30 cm) with 10-40 blue (can also be white or pink) flowers 6-8 mm long.

HABITAT Grassland.

LEAVES AND STEMS stem often branched with all leaves alternate.

Devil's-bit Scabious


Succisa pratensis

Mauve to dark violet-blue flowers on long stalks 1.5-2.5 cm across with all florets the same size.

HABITAT Grasslands, hedgerows, mountain slopes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Pointed oval, opposite, undivided leaves.





Harebell

Campanula rotundiflora

Blue bells on slender stalks. Grows 15-30 cm in open areas.

HABITAT
Dry grassland, heath, hedge banks,
dunes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Roundish leaves at base, linear leaves up stem.





Meadow Crane's-bill

Geranium pratense

Large blue flowers 2.5-3 cm across in pairs bent down after flowering but erect when fruiting.

HABITAT

Meadows, roadsides, grasslands, open woods and dunes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves cut nearly to base. Sticky hairy above.



branched tendrils at leaf tip deep blue violet flowers with no white or yellow.

Tufted Vetch

Vicia cracca

Scrambling plant with 10-40 blue violet flowers in a one sided cluster.

HABITAT

Grassy places, bushes, hedgerows.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves pinnate with 6-10 pairs of leaflets and branched tendrils at leaf tip.

Reedmace

Typha latifolia

Clumps of linear leaves 1-3m with distinctive brown sausage-shaped seed heads.

HABITAT
Ponds. streams. shallow water.

LEAVES AND STEMS Flattened grey-green leaves not

keeled and all arising from a basal shoot.


Alpine Lady's-mantle

Alchemilla alpina

Sprawling plant on acid rocks of NW England and Scotland.

HABITAT Grassy slopes on mountains.

LEAVES AND STEMS 5-7 narrow leaflets, silvery silky below.



Bilberry, Blaeberry


Vaccinium myrtillus

Small deciduous shrub with antern-shaped green-pink flowers and edible blue-black berries.

HABITAT Noods, heaths, moors.

LEAVES AND STEMS _eaves alternate, finely toothed I-3 cm long.

Branched Bur-reed

Sparganium erectum

Waterside plant with linear leaves broadside on to stem.

HABITAT Waters edge, ponds, slow rivers, marshy ground, ditches.

LEAVES AND STEMS



Linear leaves keeled at the base.

lobed leaves

Buck's horn Plantain

Plantago coronopus

Numerous greenish flower spikes with arching stems longer than the leaves.

HABITAT

Near sea, on rocks, cliffs, dry grasslands, inland paths and roadsides.

LEAVES AND STEMS Basal rosette of lobed leaves up to 20cm long.

Common Nettle

Urtica dioica

Patch-forming plant with stinging leaves and tassels of tiny flowers.

HABITAT

Wasteland, woods, fens, roadsides, hedge banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Square stems; leaves pointed and
toothed in opposite pairs with
sharp stinging hairs.

FLOWERING TIME





Greater Plantain

Plantago major

Greenish flower spikes up to 10-14 cm long.


HABITAT Waste ground, well-trodden

Waste ground, well-trodder ground, lawns.

LEAVES AND STEMS

Basal rosette of broad leaves up to 2cm long narrowing abruptly into a stalk.





Ivu

Hedera helix

Evergreen woody climber, carpeting the ground or growing up walls. trees. Flowers in green umbels.

HABITAT Woods, hedgerows, rocks, walls.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves dark green glossy above, paler below, 3-5 lobes; on flowering shoots leaves are pointed oval.

FLOWERING TIME





Lords-and-Ladies

Arum maculatum

Flower is designed to attract flies for pollination and club shaped spike releases a urine-like odour. Fruit is a spike of bright orange berries.

HABITAT Hedgerows, woodland.

LEAVES AND STEMS Shiny arrow shaped leaves often with dark spots.

FLOWERING TIME






Umbilicus rupestris


Greenish white bell shaped flowers arranged in a long spike with 'everted-umbrella' leaves.

HABITAT Rocks, banks, walls, not on lime.

LEAVES AND STEMS Circular, fleshy, bright green leaves on long fleshy stalks attached to







Ribwort Plantain

Plantago lanceolata

Greenish flower spikes of 2 cm long on long stalks up to 45cm.

HABITAT Grassy places, roadsides, hedge banks, lawns.

LEAVES AND STEMS Basal rosette of long, narrow, hairy dark green leaves to 25cm long.





Sheep's Sorrel

Rumex acetosella


Small greenish-red flowers in loose panicles on plant to 30cm tall.

HABITAT Dry grassland, heaths, shingle beaches.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves arrow-shaped at base to 4 cm long with side-lobes spreading or pointing forwards, all leaves stalked.

FLOWERING TIME





Tall Reed

Phragmites communis

A tall (to 3.5m) grass growing at the edges of waterbodies. Flowerhead is loose and purplish. White silky hairs grow from around the flowerhead.

HABITAT

Mud, shallow water by lakes, rivers, fens, bogs, saltmarshes.

LEAVES AND STEMS

Leaves grey-green; liqule (area where the leaf joins the stem) is a fringe of short hairs.





Butterbur

Petasites hybridus

Flower spikes of tiny pale pink flowers arranged down stems 10-40cm tall which appear before the leaves.

HABITAT

Wet meadows, streamsides. copses.

LEAVES AND STEMS Very large leaves up to 1m wide and downy grey beneath.



Cowberry

Vaccinium vitis-idaea

A dwarf evergreen shrub with white or pink bell-shaped flowers in short, dense clusters.



Moors, heaths, coniferous woodlands.

LEAVES AND STEMS

FLOWERING TIME



leathery leaves

Leaves leathery, untoothed, dark green above, paler dotted below with down-turned margins.



bell shaped flowers

Cross-leaved Heath

Erica tetralix

Similar to Bell Heather but pink flowers larger (0.7cm) and in a tight one-sided cluster.

HABITAT

Wet heaths, moors, bogs, acid soils.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves grey in distinct whorls of four up the stem.





Hemp-agrimony

Eupatorium cannabinum

A large plant (1-2m) often found in clumps with big heads of tiny pink flowers.

HABITAT


Open or shady, damp or dry areas; waste ground and near water.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves up to 10cm long are arranged in pairs on the reddish stem.

FLOWERING TIME

Herb-Robert

Geranium robertianum

Plant grows to 50cm with pink flowers 2 cm across.

HABITAT

Woods, hedgerows, shady places, scree, shingle, trails, garden weed especially by shady walls.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves divided to base; sometimes reddish; hairy with a strong, unpleasant smell.

FLOWERING TIME



Indian Balsam

Impatiens glandulifera



A large plant (1-3m) often found in clumps with large 'policeman's helmet' purple flowers 4cm long. This is an invasive non-native plant.

HABITAT

By streams, rivers, wet woodlands, damp places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Reddish stem, leaves with small red teeth at edge, in whorls of 3 or opposite.





Thrift

Armeria maritima

Cushion forming plant. The globular head of pink flowers is borne at the end of a stalk 5-30 cm long.

HABITAT

Coasts, on cliffs and saltmarshes. inland on mountain ledges.

LEAVES AND STEMS Flattened linear dark green leaves.



Bell Heather

Erica cinerea

purple in groups Shrub to 50cm with reddish-purple bell flowers 0.5- 0.6cm long.



Dry acid heaths and moors, open woods.

LEAVES AND STEMS Dark green and hairless leaves in threes.



flowers reddish

along stem

leaves hairless and dark green

large spiker

Buddleja



1-5m shrub with spikes of fragrant lilac (sometimes purple or white) flowers. This non-native plant is now well established in bare areas.

Waste ground or bare places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Greyish oval leaves; long arching







Marsh Thistle

Cirsium palustre

Tall thistle to 1.5m. Whole plant often reddish-tinged. Purple flower heads in crowded leafy clusters.


HABITAT

Damp grassy places.

LEAVES AND STEMS All stems continuously spinywinged, whole plant often reddish. Leaves very lobed and spiny, hairy above but shiny green.

Marsh Violet

Viola palustris

Low growing plant with pale lilac flowers with darker veins.

HABITAT Bogs, fens, marshes, wet heaths, wet woods.

LEAVES AND STEMS Few kidney shaped leaves in rosettes from creeping runners.

FLOWERING TIME

Purple-loosestrife



Lythrum salicaria

Purple-red flowers 10-15mm in diameter in long leafy spikes up to 1.5 tall.

HABITAT River edges, marshes, fens, wet woodland, damp places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Stems have 4 or more raised lines; leaves 4-7cm long, unstalked, pointed and untoothed in opposite pairs.



Red Clover

Trifolium pratense



Unstalked purple flowerheads to 3 cm on a sprawling plant to 50 cm.

HABITAT Waste ground, grassy places, roadsides.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Downy oval leaves in threes
usually with a white 'V' mark.



flower head dense and leafy. flowers 15mm long — leaves stalked

Red Dead-nettle

Lamium purpureum

Whorls of purple-red flowers 1-1.8 cm long at the base of leaves.

HABITAT

Arable and waste ground, hedgerows, roadsides, gardens.

LEAVES AND STEMS Downy, aromatic heart-shaped leaves with stalks; those near the flowers may be purple-tinged.





Selfheal

Prunella vulgaris

Violet-blue flowers 1-1.5 cm in a compact head.at the top of the stem up to 20cm tall.

HABITAT

Grassland, wood clearings, rough ground, lawns.

LEAVES AND STEMS Hairy leaves, oval to diamondshaped, often purple tinged, scarcely toothed. Plant often mat forming.

Common Butterwort

Pinguicula vulgaris

Deep violet-blue flower held on a single stem 2-15cm tall.

HABITAT Bogs, fens, wet heaths, moors, limestone flushes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Basal rosette of flat yellowish green leaves 2-8 cm long.

FLOWERING TIME



Crowberry

Empetrum nigrum

Mat-forming shrub with tiny purple stalkless starry flowers nestling among the leaves.

HABITAT Moors, bogs, wet mountain slopes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Crowded linear leaves with rolled margins up to 0.7 cm; the small berries start green, go pink, purple and finally black.

FLOWERING TIME





tiny purple flowers

Foxglove

Digitalis purpurea

Flower spikes to 1.8m with many large purple tubular flowers.


HABITAT
Open spaces, woodland clearings, heaths. mountainsides.

LEAVES AND STEMS

Great Willowherb


Epilobium hirsutum

Tall (to 2m) herb with purple-pink flowers to 2.5 cm in diameter.

HABITAT

Damp areas in grassland, woodland. Pond margins and ditches.

LEAVES AND STEMS Opposite leaves, clasping the round, downy stem.





Heather

Calluna vulgaris


Bushy evergreen shrub to 60 cm. Pinky-purple flowers in dense spikes.

HARITAT

Heaths, moors, rocky places, bogs, open woodland.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Tiny leaves pressed against stem.





Marsh Lousewort

Pedicularis palustris

Reddish flowers in a loose leafy spike on a single erect stem up to 50cm.

HABITAT

Fens, moors, damp heaths, bogs, meadows.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Deeply dissected with toothed lobes.

FLOWERING TIME J F M A M J J A S O N D



Stinking Iris

Iris foetidissima

Dull yellow-purple iris flowers with distinctive orange-seeded capsules. Plant smells strongly of meat when crushed.

HABITAT Woods, hedge banks and scrub.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves 70cm long up to 2cm wide. dark green evergreen flopping.

FLOWERING TIME



Teasel

Dipsacus fullonum

Biennial herb growing to 2m. Flower is an egg-shaped head.

HABITAT Open woods, stream banks, roadsides, rough ground, grassland, marginal habitats, railway banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS Opposite leaves have prickles and join around the stem, catching water.

FLOWERING TIME



large bright red flowers sometimes with a dark centre (7-10cm)



Common Poppy

Papaver rhoeas

The striking, bright red flowers stand out from a distance.

HABITAT Arable and waste ground, field edges, roadsides.

LEAVES AND STEMS Hairy, pinnate leaves.





Hedge Woundwort

Stachys sylvatica

Flower spike 30-80 cm with red flowers in whorls.

ΗΔΒΙΤΔΤ Woods, hedge banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves oval to heartshaped, bristly with a peculiar smell 4-9 cm long with stalks 1.5-7 cm.

FLOWERING TIME



pale red flowers without dark centres 3-7cm across



Long-headed Poppy

Papaver dubium

Pale-red flowered poppy with elongated seed heads.

HABITAT Arable and waste ground, field edges, roadsides.


LEAVES AND STEMS Hairy, pinnate leaves.

FLOWERING TIME



Marsh Cinquefoil

Potentilla palustris






LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves with 5-7 toothed leaflets becoming trefoil up the stem. Underside of leaves bluish-green.









Red Campion

Silene dioica

Deep pink flowers 2cm across on a softly hairy plant to 1m tall.

HABITAT Lowland, shady sites, woods, hedge banks, scree, cliffs.

LEAVES AND STEMS Opposite, oval, softly hairy leaves; hairy stems.

FLOWERING TIME



Scarlet Pimpernel

Anagallis arvensis

5-20cm sprawling or prostate plant with bright red (or sometimes blue or pink) flowers borne singly on long stalks from leaf axils.



Waste ground, open and arable land, sand dunes.

LEAVES AND STEMS Oval leaves opposite or whorled; square stem.

FLOWERING TIME





hairy edged petals

Water Figwort

Scrophularia auriculata

Plant 40-80cm tall, square stemmed with opposite stalked leaves and tiny two lipped red-brown flowers.

HABITAT Moist woods, marshes, by freshwater.

LEAVES AND STEMS Winged stems, blunt-tipped, round-toothed leaves.

petals fringed with white hairs trefoil leaves

Bogbean

Menyanthes trifoliata

Spikes of fringed white flowers tinged with pink.

HABITAT In shallow ponds or pools, marshes, fens, bogs.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Trefoil leaves held above the surface of the water.



Bramble

Rubus fruticosus

A scrambling shrub 1-3 m with arching stems. An aggregation of microspecies so features are variable. Flowers white or pink 2-3 cm.



Woods, scrubs, waste ground, hedge banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves with 3-5 oval leaflets hairy or prickly.

FLOWERING TIME



Cleavers

Galium aparine

Tiny white flowers on a sprawling plant reaching 1.8m and with sticky bristles which stick to clothing.


HABITAT

Cultivated and arable land, wasteground, woodland, beaches, scrub, open ground, gardens.

LEAVES AND STEMS Long four-angled stems with backward pointing prickles; leaves in whorls of 8; fruits of 2 half nutlets.

FLOWERING TIME





Blackberries

leaves usually with 3-5 leaflets



airy edged petals

Common Chickweed


Stellaria media

White flowers 0.5-1cm in diameter with petals cleft to base. Plant usually sprawling.

HABITAT

Cultivated, open waste ground, hedge banks, gardens.

LEAVES AND STEMS Stem rounded with a fine line of hairs: lower leaves long-stalked. upper leaves almost unstalked.



Common Water-plantain


Alisma plantago-aquatica

Flower spike up to 1m tall emerges from mud or water and has branches in whorls with tinu (1 cm) 3-petalled white flowers at the end.



In or beside canals, ponds, ditches, slow-moving rivers.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves rounded or heart-shaped at base.



FLOWERING TIME

Cow Parsley

Anthriscus sylvestris

One of the earliest flowering of the carrot family. 60-100 cm tall with pure white flowers 0.3mm across.

HABITAT

Hedgerows, woodland edges, roadsides.

LEAVES AND STEMS Stems hollow, without spots; fernlike leaves with pointed leaflets.

Daisy

Bellis perennis

Rosette of leaves with erect flower stems to 15cm bearing flowers 1.5-3 cm diameter, yellow in the centre with slender white outer petals, often reddish below.

HABITAT Short grassland, meadows.

LEAVES AND STEMS Spoon-shaped leaves all in a basal rosette.

Gipsywort

Lycopus europaeus

Whorls of small white flowers well spaced out along the stem at base of the leaves.

HABITAT Stream banks, ditches, fens, pond margins.

LEAVES AND STEMS Opposite leaves 5-10 cm deeply lobed with pointed tips and lobes. Leaves smell of gin and tonic when crushed.

Conium maculatum

Plant up to 2m tall with white flowers in umbels 2-5 cm across.


HABITAT Scrub, waste places, by streams.

LEAVES AND STEMS Purple-spotted stems, fine cut fern-like leaves; strong smelling and poisonous.


Japanese Knotweed

Fallopia japonica

Tall plant to 2m often forming dense thickets, flowers white in branched spikes. This is an invasive non-native plant.

HABITAT Riversides, roadsides, railway embankments, ditches,

LEAVES AND STEMS Zigzag stem reddish. Oval triangular pointed leaves.



distinctive spiral fruits creamy clustered fragrant flowers leaves divided into both large and small leaflets 1

Meadowsweet

Filipendula ulmaria


Fluffy cream heads of honeyscented flowers. Grows to 120cm.

HABITAT Wet, damp places of all kinds.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves long-stalked, pinnate with 2-5 pairs of toothed leaflets with small leaflets in between.









Oxeye Daisy

Leucanthemum vulgare

Large daisy-like flowers with dark green leaves on a plant to 70cm tall.

HABITAT Grassy places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Basal rosette of long-stalked, spoon-shaped leaves; stem leaves alternate, deeply toothed and stalkless.

Ramsons

Allium ursinum

Often carpeting damp areas with flowerstalks to 45 cm and a round head of up to 20 white flowers.

HABITAT Woods

LEAVES AND STEMS Pointed leaves arising from the base up to 25 cm long and 7 cm at the broadest point.

FLOWERING TIME



feathery seed heads in autumn and winter

Traveller's-joy Clematis vitalha

Small fragrant greenish-white flowers on a plant that scrambles over trees and shrubs and can reach 30m.



Hedgerows, scrub, woodland, especially on limestone areas.

LEAVES AND STEMS Paired leaves divided into pointed leaflets.

FLOWERING TIME





pinnate leaves divided into leaflets

White Dead-nettle

Lamium album

Hairy plant 20-60 cm with white flowers 2-3 cm long in spaced whorls at the base of leaves.

HABITAT

Hedge banks, roadsides, wasteland.

LEAVES AND STEMS Stems four-edged; leaves opposite, toothed oval to heart-shaped with stalks, look like nettle leaves but don't sting.





WHITE



Wild carrot

Daucus carota

Long stalked white flowered umbels 7 cm across often with central flower red.

HABITAT Grassland, cliffs, roadsides, hedge banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS Roughly hairy stem solid and ridged; very divided leaves with narrow segments.

Wood Anemone

Anemone nemorosa

Star-like white flowers with 5-8 petals, often pink underneath.

HABITAT Woodlands, old hedge banks, upland meadows.

LEAVES AND STEMS Long-stalked stem leaves divided into three.

FLOWERING TIME





Oxalis acetosella

Solitary white flowers and trifoliate leaves to 10cm tall.


HABITAT Shady, dry oakwoods, beechwoods, rocks.

pale green trefoil leaves LEAVES AND STEMS Delicate yellow-green trefoil leaves.









Woodruff

Galium odoratum

Grows in carpets with loose heads of small funnel-shaped white flowers. Plants are 15-30 cm tall, upright and unbranched.

HABITAT Woods.

LEAVES AND STEMS Four-angled stems; leaves elliptical in whorls of 6-9; tiny forwardpointing prickles on the edges.

FLOWERING TIME

Yarrow

Achillea millefolium

Umbel-like heads of small white (rarely pink) flowers on tough stems.

HABITAT Grassland, banks and waysides.

LEAVES AND STEMS
Very dissected feathery leaves
which smell aromatic when
crushed.

FLOWERING TIME





very divided feathery leaves

Agrimony

Agrimonia eupatoria


Spikes to 60cm of yellow flowers 5-8mm in diameter.

HABITAT

Hedge banks, road verges, rough, grassy places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Softly hairy, often reddish stems; lower leaves pinnate with 3-6 pairs of larger toothed leaflets interspersed with smaller leaflets.






Alexanders

Smyrnium olusatrum

Plant to 1.5m tall with umbels of yellow flowers, each one 0.1-0.5 cm wide.

HABITAT Waste places, roadsides, hedge banks.

LEAVES AND STEMS Shiny green celery scented leaves; stems broad and solid becoming hollow with age.



star-like flowers with 6 petals basal tufts of narrrow flattened leaves

Bog Asphodel

Iris pseudacorus

Large yellow flowers amidst a profusion of erect grey-green leaves.

HABITAT

Wet meadows, fens, ditches, marshes, by lakes and rivers.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves with a raised mid-rib (not triangular in cross-section) sword shaped, greyish-green 90cm long, to 30cm wide.









Yellow Rattle

Rhinanthus minor

Small bright yellow flower and inflated pale green calyx.

HABITAT

Parasitic on grasses, so found in any open grassy places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves unstalked, opposite, narrow and toothed. Stem black-spotted.

Fern with an underground creeping rhizome with leaves (around 0.6-2m long) arising at intervals. Bracken can sometimes be invasive.

Deciduous highly divided leaves
can be more than 2m long with
stalks over 1m. Brown stems
remain through winter.

Phyllitis scolopendrium

Woods, hedge banks, shady rocks, walls, ditch sides, inside wells/drains.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves 10-60 cm long pointed at tip and heart-shaped at base, glossy green above.

Fraxinus excelsior

Tree to 45m tall domed and open.



Found on base rich and damp soil. Native in SE England and SE Wales.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves opposite, pinnate. Dark green above. Black buds. Smooth bark when young. Fruit with a single wing.

Tree to 40 m, domed and much-branched. Native in SE England and SE Wales.

HABITAT Well drained soil.

LEAVES AND STEMS Smooth grey bark; slender longpointed bud.





Sorbus aucuparia

Trees up to 15m, often planted, with umbels of white flowers (0.8-1 cm) followed by bunches of red berries.

HABITAT Woods, moors, rocky places.

LEAVES AND STEMS Leaves pinnate with each toothed leaflet to 6 x 2 cm long.
