## New Hope for Dorset Meadows as Ryewater Farm Nature Reserve Expands

- Plantlife acquires 4.45 acres of land extending vital nature reserve by 12%
- Grasslands restoration efforts will begin summer 2025 to make more wildflower meadows
- Restoring meadows will boost rare and threatened wildflowers

Plantlife's Ryewater Farm Nature Reserve near Corscombe, North Dorset, is to be expanded following the purchase of 4.45 acres (1.8ha) of land neighbouring the existing site, so it can be restored to species-rich grassland.

The expansion has been made possible with a substantial grant from The National Lottery Heritage Fund, along with a successful fundraising appeal by charity Plantlife. This combined fundraising approach enables immediate purchase, initial action and long-term management of the Nature Reserve.

The initial work to clear the site of waste will take place when weather and ground conditions are suitable, as the site becomes too wet and inaccessible to carry this out over the winter. Other work will include fencing to prepare the site for future conservation grazing following species surveys and a hay cut. The site will be monitored to measure the biodiversity and habitat quality over time.

Plantlife ownership and management of the site will enlarge the Ryewater Farm Nature Reserve, improve the condition and significantly enhance the grassland on the new section of this Site of Special Scientific Interest in the long term.

The original Ryewater Farm Nature Reserve is a 38-acre nature reserve that is a haven for a diverse range of plants and fungi including Common Spotted Orchid *Dactylorhiza fuchsii* and Devils-Bit Scabious *Succisa pratensis*. It is designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest, Special Area of Conservation and an important area of species-rich wildflower meadows. Over the last 30 years the meadows at Ryewater Farm have increased in plant diversity with key species, including Yellow rattle, Common Spotted Orchid and Common Knapweed, increasing markedly.

## Paul Rowland, Conservation Land Manager, Plantlife, said:

"Meadows support more priority wildlife and species than any other habitat – they are essential to life. Restoring this land to favourable condition will help us transform it to a species-rich ecosystem, protecting wild plant species, such as Common spotted orchid, Pignut and Yellow rattle, alongside the dormice and protected bat species that live there."

Meadows are one of the most magnificent but threatened habitats. Just 3% have survived in the UK, compared with their area less than a century ago. Botanically rich habitats, it is estimated that meadows home 1,400 different species of invertebrates.

#### Notes to editors:

Common spotted orchid *Dactylorhiza fuchsii:* Flowers in a dense spike, pale pink with a darker streak and dot markings

Pignut *Conopodium majus*: Common in open woodland, hedgerows and dry grassland, pignut is a small umbellifer with fine leaves and delicate stems.

Yellow Rattle *Rhinanthus minor*: More or less hairless plant up to 50cm tall with spikes of yellow two-lipped flowers.
