



## Scurvygrass

*Cochlearia officinalis*

This salt-tolerant coastal plant has fleshy green to red leaves and white four-petaled flowers. It also grows along the edges of salted roads in winter.



## Shepherd's Purse

*Capsella bursa-pastoris*

Small four-petaled white flowers grow on long stalks held horizontally from the main stem. The fruits are flat and heart-shaped, and stand upright.



## Alternate-leaved Golden Saxifrage

*Chrysosplenium alternifolium*

Tiny yellowish green flowers on a low growing patch-forming plant. It has a square shaped stem with paired leaves.



## Early Dog-violet

*Viola reichenbachiana*

Solitary bluish-purple flowers with five petals often has darker veins on the lower petals. Leaves are heart-shaped and grow around the base of the plant.



## Wood Sorrel

*Oxalis acetosella*

Solitary white flowers with darker veins. Delicate yellow-green clover-like leaves.



## Wood Anemone

*Anemone nemorosa*

Star-shaped white flowers with 5-8 petals, often pink underneath. Stem leaves are divided into three and have long stalks.



## White Dead-nettle

*Lamium album*

Hairy nettle-like leaves without the sting (the reason why it's called 'dead'-nettle) on a square stem. White two-lipped flowers 2-3cm long.



## Marsh Marigold

*Caltha palustris*

Yellow buttercup-like flowers 2-4cm across on a mound of kidney-shaped, shiny leaves.



## Ramsons

*Allium ursinum*

Stalks up to 45cm tall, with a round head of white flowers at the top. Long pointed leaves grow from the base of the plant. Smells of garlic when crushed.
