



**Herb Robert**  
*Geranium robertianum*

This plant looks much prettier than it smells, which isn't very nice! It grows low on the ground with reddish stems. It has small pink flowers with 5 petals.




**Creeping Buttercup**  
*Ranunculus repens*

It has yellow flowers and hairy leaves divided into three. It's long rooting runners help it to spread across damp areas of grass, unlike other types of Buttercup.




**Bird's-foot-trefoil**  
*Lotus corniculatus*

Often grows low to the ground and has clusters of yellow flowers with bits of red. The leaves have 5 narrow oval leaflets and the bottom two are bent back.




**Oxeye Daisy**  
*Leucanthemum vulgare*

Looks like a big daisy with white petals and a yellow centre. It grows on a tall stem, up to 70cm tall. The leaves are dark green and shaped like spoons.




**Common Knapweed**  
*Centaurea nigra*

It looks like a similar to a thistle, with a round black or brown head topped with sharp purple, pink, or sometimes white spikes.



**Common Dandelion**  
*Taraxacum officinale*

The bright yellow flower grows on a single stem with large, green jagged leaves. If you look closely you'll see tiny flowers within the main flower head.
